



Irish soda bread makes the perfect St. Patrick's Day appetizer

Irish cuisine may not be as widely recognizable or familiar across North America as Chinese, Italian or Mexican fare. But that doesn't mean Irish food lacks fans and flavor. As the world prepares to celebrate St. Patrick's Day on or around March 17, individuals who want to include some popular Irish fare in their festivities won't want to exclude this recipe for "Irish Soda Bread" from AllRecipes.com.

Irish Soda Bread Yields 1 1/2 Ioaf (20 servings)

4	cups all-purpose flour
1/2	cup margarine, softened
4	tablespoons white sugar
1	teaspoon baking soda
1	tablespoon baking powder
1/2	teaspoon salt
1	cup buttermilk
1	egg
1/4	cup butter, melted
1/4	cup buttermilk



Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Lightly grease a large baking sheet.

Mix flour, softened margarine, sugar, baking soda, baking powder, and salt together in a large bowl. Stir in 1 cup of buttermilk and egg. Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface and knead slightly. Form dough into a round and place on the prepared baking sheet.

Combine melted butter with 1/4 cup buttermilk in a small bowl; brush loaf with this mixture. Use a sharp knife to cut an "X" into the top of the loaf.

Bake in preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the center of the loaf comes out clean, 45 to 50 minutes. Check for doneness after 30 minutes. You may continue to brush the loaf with the butter mixture while it bakes.

Warning signs of developing mental health issues

Even though the stigma surrounding mental health issues has decreased considerably in recent years, women still face societal barriers, says McLean Mass General Brigham Hospital. Women may not be inclined to discuss their issues and, in turn, fail to receive prompt care.

Signs of mental illness vary, depending on the disorder and additional variables. A condition may affect a person's emotions, behaviors and thoughts. Some signs of a burgeoning mental illness include:

- Significant changes in sleep habits, which may include sleeping more or not at all.
- Changes in eating behaviors, which may include binge eating or going without food.
- Women tend to internalize mental illness, and symptoms can include ruminating, withdrawal from activities and generally retreating from life.
- ~ Physical conditions that cannot be explained, such as headaches, stomach aches, chronic pain, and even high blood pressure.
- Emotional lability, which means rapid mood swings from happiness to anger and sadness.
- ~ Confused thinking or a reduced ability to concentrate.
- ~ Excessive fears or worries.
- ~ Detachment from reality, resulting in delusions.
- Trouble relating to situations and people.
- ~ Changes to sex drive.
- ~ Excessive anger or hostility.
- ~ Suicidal thoughts or attempts.

Mental illness can affect anyone. According to research, women may have a higher propensity to develop certain mental health conditions and thus need to be aware of the symptoms of those disorders. Anyone in crisis should call 911 or their local emergency number immediately. In the United States and Canada, women can call or text 988 to reach suicide and crisis support.





Try a new meat and potatoes dish this St. Patrick's Day

St. Patrick's Day presents the perfect opportunity to try authentic Irish cuisine as well as foods and beverages that have become associated strictly with the holiday (like green beer). It's likely someone you know will be cooking corned beef and cabbage this St. Patrick's Day. But what if you're among those who just doesn't fancy the salted and pickled flavoring of this familiar favorite? "Zesty Braised Beef with New Potatoes" isn't exactly corned beef, but it can be a worthy alternative. It's warm, filling and flavorful, and can be just the thing to eat on a chilly March day. What's more, this rich beef can pair well with a dark stout like Guinness. Enjoy this recipe, courtesy of "The Healthy Slow Cooker" (Robert Rose) by Judith Finlayson.

Zesty Braised Beef with New Potatoes(Serves 8)

- 2 tablespoons olive oil, divided
- 2 ounces chunk pancetta, preferably hot pancetta, diced
- 2 pounds trimmed stewing beef, cut into 1-inch cubes and patted dry
- 2 onions, finely chopped
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon sea salt
- 1/2 teaspoon cracked black peppercorns
- 1/2 cup dry white wine
- 2 cups chicken stock
- 2 pounds small new potatoes, scrubbed and thinly sliced (about 30 tiny ones)
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper, dissolved in 1 tablespoon freshly squeezed lemon juice
- 1/4 cup finely chopped parsley leaves.

1. In a skillet, heat 1 tablespoon of the oil over medium-high heat. Add pancetta and cook, stirring, until nicely browned, about 3 minutes. Transfer to slow cooker stoneware (31/2 to 5 quart).

2. Add beef to skillet, in batches, and cook, stirring until browned, about 4 minutes per batch. Transfer to stoneware as completed.
3. Reduce heat to medium. Add remaining tablespoon of oil to pan. Add onions and cook, stirring, until softened, about 3 minutes.
Add garlic, thyme, salt and peppercorns and cook, stirring, for 1 minute. Add wine, bring to a boil and boil, stirring and scraping up brown bits from bottom of pan for 2 minutes.

4. Transfer to stoneware. Cover and cook on low for 8 hours or on high for 4 hours, until potatoes are tender. Stir in cayenne solution. Cover and cook on high for 10 minutes. Transfer to a server dish and garnish with parsley. Serve with a big platter of roasted carrots.



How nutritional needs change with age

- ~ Eat fortified cereals and grains: The ability to absorb vitamin B12 can decrease as one gets older and with the use of certain medicines. Many health professionals recommend patients get more vitamin B12 by consuming foods enriched with this vitamin. Vitamin supplements may be needed in addition to food.
- Drink more fluids: Health.com says sensation of thirst declines with age. Drinking water and other fluids becomes a priority to stay hydrated. It also helps with digestion.
- Prioritize bone health: Osteoporosis is a concern for older adults, particularly women who have reached menopause. Osteoporosis occurs when bones become brittle and can break from only the slightest bump or fall, says the Mayo Clinic. Vitamin D and calcium help strengthen bones, and older adults may need more of these nutrients.

Individuals should speak with their health care providers and nutritionists for further insight into their changing nutritional needs. Such professionals can help customize diets to address specific health concerns.







CITRUS COUNTY GHOST TOWNS

GHOST TOWNS bring out an often intense curiosity in many people. Those visiting the West or watching old Western movies with hteir classical movie sets are entranced by them. On such trips, many will take a long, rough side trip up a dusty road to wander through a tumbleweed-covered street bordered by graying houses and stores, imagining how things might have looked, long ago, with ghosts walking through them. Some are tourist traps, others emptied of life for more than 100-125 years.

🔚 Florida also has such ghost towns to visit (Google "Florida ghost towns"). Some in Florida are complete with old "haunted" 📌 structures; others have left little behind. That is the case for the ghost towns of Citrus County.

Except for limestone or brick house foundations, or, perhaps a large marble slab remaining on the ground from the old entranceway to a house, Citrus County ghost towns have little to tell us of the past. Often found are metal scraps, rusty car or truck parts or frames, or farm equipment covered with weeds. Much was carried away to build later homes as these communities shriveled up and disappeared. Tombstones poke up through weeds in uncared-for cemeteries.

The following map taken from my historical time-travel novel, CITRUS WHITE GOLD, shows some of the towns and roads in existence in Citrus County from 1891 to 1899. Recognizable today with residual remains are some, others with nothing to show. Arlington, Bridgers, Citronelle, Fairmount, Mannfield, Mt. Lee, Oakdale, Orleans, Rosehill, Stage Pond, and Viana are some of our ghost towns.

Except for abandoned cemeteries at Bridgers, Mannfield, and an active one at Stage Pond, there is not much to see, except for the bricks and stones of the foundations, or an old concrete cattle dip that can be seen in Mannfield.

Many people call it Mansfield. That is not the correct name. It is Mannfield, named after Florida State Senator Austin Shuey Mann (1847-1914). Mann was responsible for dividing Hernando County into three new countries, Citrus, Hernando, and Pasco.

Try to find these old Citrus County towns using Google or old USGS topographic maps available in the files of the Citrus County Historical Society located in the Old Citrus Courthouse Museum in Inverness. And, if you locate them in the field, close your eyes to a squint and imagine what these small towns might have looked like those many years ago, with their inhabitants going about their daily lives.

However, more than ghost towns, there is other evidence of the daily activity of our early settlers and workers in Citrus County. Citrus and mining played a big role in the county's development and growth. Not much remains of the Citrus production activity as most of the Citrus groves were killed off in the great back-to-back freezes of 1894-95.

Many of you have biked, roller-bladed, or walked along the Withlacoochee State Trail running from Trilby in northeastmost Pasco County, through Hernando County, and stopping at Citrus Springs in Citrus County.

In a narrow stretch of land running from southeast of Floral City to Dunnellon, on both sides of US Highway 41 and also along State Road 200, there are countless old phosphate mine pits, some with leftover remains, mainly pipes used for processing the phosphate ore. Also, along, County Road 581 (South Pleasant Grove Road) there are two phosphate-mining locations to visit within the Withlacoochee State Forest: (1) Holder Mine and (2) Mutual Mine, with their abandoned deep pits.

🔚 One particular area of interest, readily accessible, is in Hernando, Florida.

Let's say, after breakfast at Chicken King (the best sausage biscuit and gravy), you hop on your bike or walk northwest from where the Withlacoochee State Trail crosses West Norvell Bryant Highway (County Road 486). When you reach the point where the trail crosses East Lake Lane (about 600 feet), look on the corner to your right. Here there is a large, rusty steel tank and related structures left over from the 1890s to early 1900s phosphate-ming operations. This tall tank held water used to wash 🏓 impurities from the phosphate ore before being loaded on trains to be carried to the Withlacoochee River for water transport on barges to the Gulf of Mexico and ships, with most of the ore going to Germany.

st Biking/walking further northwest on the trail, note the number of deep old phosphate mining pits on both sides, some with abandoned large-diameter steel pipes at their bottoms.

However, if you prefer a walk in the woods to that of riding a bicycle down the paved trail, there is another rewarding location to 쎭 visit: Old Mannfield, Citrus County's first county seat, established by Senator Mann.

From Lecanto, Florida start at the intersection of Highway 44 and South Lecanto Highway (county road 491) and drive about, 5 miles south until around the second curve you come to West Nobel Street. Across 491 you can park your vehicle and with a compass start your walk due southeast on a sandy road (don't go on the road leading north) until you come to the willow-filled former pond and abandoned town of Mannfield. Walk around, and look for signs of former habitation. The old cattle dip tank 3

Ҳ (about 30 feet long, 3 feet wide, and 7 feet deep, and used 💐 for eliminating ticks on the cattle) is readily seen, as is 📌 a pipe from an old well, sticking up. In the 1890s the pond 3 contained water, but is now choked with willows.

If you have the time, try to locate the old Mannfield Cemetery, to the north of Mannfield (it is shown on Google Maps). In the small fenced-in plot are weathered tombstones and a newer, coarse-grained white marble monument streaked diagonally with black, the tomb of Lucinda Wilson (1824-1897). It reads: Shall ever be a Guiding Star in Heaven.

Mannfield no longer existed after 1917, when it was no longer shown on USGS maps. Mannfield, Hernando, and other Citrus County towns are featured in CITRUS WHITE GOLD.



The world's most popular beers

According to Vine Pair, beer is the most popular alcoholic beverage in the world. The global beer market is valued at more than \$790 billion dollars. Beer brand popularity depends on the system of measurement. Data from Brand Finance, a leading brand valuation consultancy firm, shows that Heineken is the most valuable beer brand in the world, followed closely by Corona Extra. Creative hobbies can lead to personal and professional growth






Paws off! Practice pet poison prevention

Companion animals typically do not understand that certain items in their environments can be harmful. Pets' innate curiosity coupled with unique aromas produced by common household items can put them in jeopardy of potentially deadly poisoning. According to veterinary experts at WebMD Pet Health Center, an estimated 232,000 cases of pet poisoning occur annually in the United States. In March 2022, the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center hotline fielded 22 percent more calls stemming from incidents of pet toxicity than in 2021. The following are some steps pet owners can take to protect their companion animals against poisoning.

- ~ Don't leave out human food. Dogs, cats and other animals may be lured by the sweet temptation of their owners' food. Many food scraps can be toxic to pets, including alcoholic beverages, chocolate, coffee beans, moldy foods, and raisins, among others. Keep the kitchen tidy and trash cans (indoor and outdoor) secured.
- Be careful with houseplants. While they may look beautiful and filter indoor air, certain houseplants can be toxic to pets if ingested. Before bringing any new plants into your home, check the ASPCA Toxic and Non-Toxic Plant Guide. Lilies may be pretty, but they also are quite toxic. The smallest nibble can be fatal to cats.
- Keep medications locked away. Be sure that overthe-counter and prescription medications are locked away and cannot be accessed by curious pets. Even seemingly mild medications, like human pain relievers, can be toxic to pets.
- Be safe when spring cleaning. Keep pets out of rooms when they are being cleaned by chemical products or when using insecticides. Wait a day or more before letting pets back into the area. Store products beyond a pet's reach when they're not in use.

With diligence, a significant percentage of pet poisonings can be prevented. Pet owners should do their homework about toxic items in and around their homes and do their best to keep pets safe.
