



Did you know?

The start of the National Football League season is cause for celebration for millions of fans, but this year's season may prove especially intriguing for supporters of the Kansas City Chiefs. That's because the two-time defending Super Bowl champion Chiefs have an opportunity to make history during the 2024-25 season. According to BetMGM Sportsbook, no NFL team has ever won three consecutive Super Bowls. The Chiefs, who defeated the Philadelphia Eagles 38-35 in Super Bowl LVII in 2023 and the San Francisco 49ers 25-22 in Super Bowl LVIII in 2024, have a chance to be the first to accomplish that elusive feat. Other teams, including the Miami Dolphins between 1971 and 1973, and more recently the New England Patriots between 2016 and 2018, appeared in back-to-back-toback Super Bowls, but neither franchise won three consecutive Super Bowls. The Buffalo Bills appeared in four consecutive Super Bowls in the early 1990s, but notably lost all four contests. The Chiefs kick off their 2024 run at history at home versus the Baltimore Ravens on Thursday, September 5.

A brief rundown on tropical storm watches and warnings

Preparedness is of paramount importance when storm seasons kick into high gear. Supplies are the first thing many people think of when preparing for storms, and rightfully so. But it's equally important that people living in areas vulnerable to certain types of storms learn to distinguish the differences between storm watches and storm warnings. The National Weather Service (NWS) offers the following breakdown to help people learn what makes a storm watch different from a storm warning.

- ~ Hurricane watch: The National Hurricane Center (NHC) is the division of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Association/NWS that is responsible for tracking and predicting tropical weather systems. When the NHC issues a hurricane watch, that means hurricane conditions, which are defined as sustained winds of 74 miles per hour or greater, are possible within the area where the watch is issued. The NWS notes it may not be safe to prepare for a hurricane once winds reach tropical storm force, so the NHC issues hurricane watches 48 hours before it anticipates the arrival of such winds.
- Hurricane warning: A hurricane warning is issued 36 hours in advance of the arrival of tropical-storm-force winds (sustained winds of 74 miles per hour or greater).
- ~ Tropical storm watch: A tropical storm watch is declared when sustained winds between 39 and 73 miles per hour are possible within a specified area. A tropical storm watch indicates such winds are possible within 48 hours.
- ~ Tropical storm warning: A tropical storm warning is issued when sustained winds between 39 and 73 miles per hour are expected within a specified area within 36 hours.
- Storm surge watch: A storm surge watch is issued when there is a possibility of life-threatening inundation from rising water moving inland from the shoreline within a specified area. The storm surge watch is generally issued within 48 hours of the expected arrival of such conditions.
- ~ Storm surge warning: A storm surge warning indicates the danger of life-threatening inundation from rising water moving inland from the shoreline within a specified area within 36 hours. Storm watches and warnings are issued to help people prepare for the potential arrival of serious storms that could prove dangerous and deadly. More information is available at weather.gov/safety/hurricane.







These dessert bars are peachy keen

Summer is a time of year when people can enjoy their pick of fresh fruit at farm stands, supermarkets and other retailers. Many fruit trees, plants and bushes are ready for harvest in the spring and summer, meaning there's no limit to the number of delicious recipes one can whip up with these sweet offerings.

Peaches are a favorite ingredient in many different types of desserts, from cobblers to pies. But in this recipe for "Fresh Peach Crumble Bar," peaches are presented as a cross between a cake and cookie. Enjoy this recipe, courtesy of Saving Room for Dessert, as adapted from AllRecipes.com.



- 1. Preheat oven to 350 F if using a glass pan or dark metal pan, or 375 F for a light metal pan. Lightly grease or spray a 13 x 9-inch baking pan and set aside.
- 2. In a medium bowl, whisk together 1 cup of sugar, 3 cups of flour, baking powder, salt and cinnamon. Using a pastry cutter, blend in the butter until the mixture resembles coarse sand. Add the lightly beaten egg and mix until the dough starts to hold together, but is still crumbly. Gently press a little more than half the dough into the prepared pan. (Optional: Use a food processor to process these ingredients.)
- 3. In a large mixing bowl, whisk together the sugar, cornstarch and cinnamon. Add the diced peaches and toss to combine. Drizzle the lemon juice over the peaches and toss to coat. Pour the peach mixture over the crust and spread evenly.
- 4. Using your hands, press together handfuls of the remaining crumb topping to create clumps. Scatter the clumps and remaining crumbled topping over the fruit layer, leaving some peaches showing through.
- 5. If using a glass pan, bake at 350 F for 50 to 55 minutes or until lightly browned. If using a metal pan, bake at 375 F for 40 to 45 minutes. Cool completely, then chill before cutting and icing.
- 6. Whisk together the powdered sugar, almond extract and milk. Drizzle on the bars just before serving.



Did you know?

Wearing eyeglasses is not strictly reserved for adults. In fact, many children wear eyeglasses, and they may need them for different reasons. The American Association for Pediatric Ophthalmology and Strabismus says children may benefit from glasses while their visual systems are still developing, within the first 12 years of life. Glasses can be important for the normal development of kids' vision, including providing better vision; straightening crossed or misaligned eyes; protecting one eye that sees better when the other eye has poor vision; and strengthening a weak (lazy) eye. The University of Rochester Medical Center says a child may get his or her first pair of glasses as young as a few months of age, but health care providers who specialize in pediatric eye care say kids usually become nearsighted or farsighted between the ages of six and 12. It's recommended children have an eye screening before they enter school. In addition, the American Academy of Ophthalmology and the American Optometric Association recommends vision screening for all infants, preschoolers and school-aged children.

Raise the stakes of family game night

Getting the entire family together can take a little effort. There is no shortage of activities that pull family members apart most days of the week, from work obligations to sports practices to school events. The United Kingdom-based media provider Independent reported in 2023 on a study of 2,000 parents with children at home. The study found families are only spending six hours a week together, which is less than an hour each day. Furthermore, they only eat meals as a household four days out of seven. Eking out more time for family may be as easy as scheduling activities that everyone can rally behind. Family game nights give everyone an excuse to gather at least once a week. These tips can make family game night a can't-miss activity.

- ~ Start with simple games and branch out. The first step to a successful family game night is choosing the right game to engage all participants. This can be challenging when there are young children, teenagers, middle-aged adults, and even seniors participating. Visit an independently owned toy and games store and pick the brain of the proprietor. He or she will likely have some suggestions to get you started. As participants become more comfortable, you can branch out with games.
- Make it a recurring event. Set a firm day of the week for the game night. This way participants will block out that date and time and make every attempt to attend. Treat game night like any other important appointment.
- Consider games with movement. Game night doesn't have to mean sitting around a board game, which young children who have trouble sitting still may characterize as a "bored" game. Games that get people moving, whether it's charades, drawing games or a game such as Twister^a can be more engaging. Game night also can take activities to a golf driving range or an arcade.
- \sim Gather for the right reasons. Game night should focus on having the entire family together laughing and competing in a good-natured way. It should not be a strict competition where winning is the only goal. Avoid the potential for sore losers who can sour game nights in a flash by letting everyone know that fun is the foremost priority of the night.
- Offer prizes. Encourage participation with the lure of prizes at the end. Prizes will not just go to the overall winner. There can be

humorous awards, such as the player who messed up trivia questions the most, or the one who rolled matching pairs of the dice most frequently. You can customize the winning categories depending on the game played so everyone gets a fighting chance at a prize. Keep awards simple, like candy bars or other appealing treats.

Identify a "game master." Every game night should feature a game master who presides over the rules of the game. The rules can be the ones strictly off of the information sheet, or the ones you customize for your own fun. The game master's job is to make sure the rules are enforced, but also to determine when it's alright to let things slide.

Family game nights are a vital way to bring everyone together at least once a week in a manner that is entertaining and fosters solid family relationships.



Tips to care for outdoor cats

Pet preferences vary across the world, but dogs and cats are beloved companion animals in many corners of the globe. According to the 2022 Statista Global Consumer Survey, dogs have a good lead over their feline counterparts in the United States, mainland China, the United Kingdom, and Japan. However, in Germany, cats and dogs are kept by a nearly equal number of pet owners.

Even though cats may not be as popular as dogs, they are widely found in homes. They also may be spending time outside of homes. While there are plenty of feral cats, or those that



Leash-train the cat:The American Humane Society suggests leash-training cats that want to be outdoors. Much like having a dog on a leash prevents the pet from running off and getting lost or injured, cats who may be a little too independent for their own good can be curtailed with leashes.

Vaccinate and fix the animal:Cats that are exposed to the outdoors are more susceptible to diseases that can be harmful or even fatal. Speak with a vet about which vaccines the cat will require if he or she is going to be spending considerable time outdoors. Also, while it is recommended for all companion animals to be spayed or neutered, it is especially important for those with access to the outdoors to prevent unwanted mating that can exacerbate overpopulation issues. Plus, animals that are fixed are less likely to roam or fight.

Create a shelter:In addition to providing free access to the home by way of a cat door, outdoor access cats may benefit from a home in the yard. This can protect the cat from weather or other animals. A pet owner can build a shelter or purchase pre-made varieties that resemble a chicken coop. It's also best to ensure cats have access to fresh water while outside. Regularly inspect the shelter to keep it clean and in good repair.

Consider a "catio":Some cats will be satisfied with something that lets fresh air in without having to be completely outdoors. A "catio" is an outdoor ledge or enclosure for cats that is covered by grating or mesh, according to Habitat Have. It can be attached to a window or be freestanding in an area of the yard, providing a lounging spot that is outdoors but protected.

Provide identification:Cat caregivers can microchip cats and ensure they are wearing the proper identification. If the cat cannot find its way home, there is a greater chance the animal will be found if identification is present or a chip has been installed. Although cats are safest indoors, with some precautions, cats can enjoy the fresh air and sunshine.
