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
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
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

Stuffed Mushrooms ((Makes 28 servings))

Olive oil, to coat baking sheet

28 mushrooms (21/2 inches in diameter), stemmed

1/2 cup butter (1 stick) small onion, minced

2 cloves of garlic, peeled and minced

3/4 cup Italian breadcrumbs 1/2 cup Romano cheese, grated

3 tablespoons fresh Italian parsley, chopped

Salt, to taste

Freshly ground black pepper, to taste

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 F. Drizzle olive oil on baking sheet and coat thoroughly.
- 2. Gently clean the mushrooms and remove stems. Finely chop stems. Melt butter in a skillet over medium heat. Add stems, onion and garlic, and saute' until stems and onions are soft and garlic is fragrant.
- 3. In a mixing bowl, add bread crumbs, cheese and parsley. Season with salt and pepper and stir to combine. Add sautued mixture to bread crumb mixture and mix well.
- 4. Spoon filling mixture into mushroom caps. Arrange on prepared baking sheet, stuffed side up. Bake about 20 to 25 minutes, or until the mushrooms are tender and the tops are golden. Cool for several minutes before serving. Arrange on serving tray or platter. Serve. Preparation time: 15 minutes ~ Cooking time: 35 minutes ~ Total time: 50 minutes ~ Difficulty: Easy



Fishing for Fun:Hang strings on the straight ends of candy canes to fashion fishing poles, with the curved ends serving as the "hooks." Participants try to "fish" smaller candy canes out of a bowl and see how many they can reel in.

The "No L" Game:The game referee has a list of a few categories (i.e., food, sports, colors, cars, etc.) and players are split into a few teams. When the category is called, the teams have to jot down as many words as they can pertaining to the category that do not have a letter "L" in them before a timer runs out.

These are just a few festive ways to have fun with friends or family members during holiday gatherings.







According to a research review published in the journal Obesity, the average person gains between 0.8 and 2 pounds during the holiday season. Food represents more than just nutrition this time of year, as family gatherings around the dinner table are about tradition and fellowship. While no one wants to feel deprived when holiday celebrations arrive, it is important to make smart choices and continue to prioritize health as much as possible. These seven tips can help.

1. Plan your daily eating. Scale back meals accordingly if a large family feast is on the docket at dinnertime. While you shouldn't skip meals altogether, a light breakfast or lunch may enable you to save more calories for dinner and treats to come later in the evening.

2. Aim for mostly healthy foods. Buttery rolls, fatty roasts, candied yams, and pies come out in full force during the holidays. Try to make the majority of your plate full of lean protein, low-fat dairy and plenty of vegetables and whole grains. Then you can splurge on one or two foods like pumpkin pie.

3. Remain physically active. It may be tempting to hibernate inside watching heartfelt holiday movies on television, but resist the urge to be sedentary. Keep up normal fitness routines, aiming for the recommended 150 minutes of moderate-intensity exercise per week or 75 minutes of vigorous-intensity exercise. Take the stairs at malls and park further away from stores when shopping for the holidays to add a little extra movement to your day.

Did you know?

Domestic violence is a growing concern in some areas of North America. According to Statistics Canada, in 2021 there were 127,082 victims of police-reported family violence (violence committed by a spouse, parent, child, sibling, or extended family member), a rate of 336 victims per 100,000 population. Data indicates this was the fifth consecutive year that domestic violence incidents rose in Canada. In addition, 114,132 individuals age 12 years and older were victims of intimate partner violence (violence committed by a current and former legally married spouse, common-law partner, dating partner, or other intimate partner). The National Domestic Violence Hotline indicates an average of 24 people per minute are victims of rape, physical violence or stalking by an intimate partner in the United States. That adds up to more than 12 million male and female victims in a single year. One in four women and one in seven men age 18 and older in the United States have been victims of domestic abuse in their lifetimes.

- tablespoon good-quality olive oil
- 2 cups chopped smoked sausage
- 2 cups sliced mushrooms
- 2 cloves of garlic, peeled and minced
- 8 fresh eggs
- 3 1/2 tablespoons heavy cream
- teaspoon fresh ground black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- cup cheddar cheese, grated

1. Preheat oven broiler.

- 2. Heat the oil in a 10-inch nonstick, ovenproof skillet. Add sausage and saute until it begins to brown, about 3 minutes. Add mushrooms and saute until golden, about 3 additional minutes. Stir in garlic and cook until fragrant, about 30 seconds.
- 3. Combine the eggs, heavy cream, salt, and pepper in a blender; process until frothy. Pour the egg mixture into the skillet with the sausage mixture and cook, undisturbed, until the sides and bottom are set but center is loose, about 4 minutes.
- 4. Sprinkle cheese over the top and place skillet under broiler and cook until mixture is just set on top and cooked through, about 3 to 4 minutes. Cool 2 minutes, slice and serve.



Protect pets both inside and outside the home

Newly adopted pets waste little time becoming beloved members of a household. But much like young children, pets are a significant responsibility, and they rely on their human caretakers to ensure their safety.

Pets are susceptible to illness and injury just like their human companions. The Pet Poison Hotline reported a 51 percent increase in the volume of calls between 2020 and 2021. Banfield Pet Hospitals also saw about half a million more pet visits in 2020 than in 2019. Furthermore, Dogster reports that 47 percent of pet owners had to deal with a serious medical issue or took their pets to emergency care in 2021.

Keeping cherished pets safe in and around a home is no small task. But with some diligence, it is possible to ensure health and happiness for companion animals. Follow these tips, courtesy of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, Old Farm Veterinary Hospital and Security.org.

- ~Consider an indoor and outdoor security camera system. Having eyes on pets while you're away from home enables a quick response should something happen.
- ~ Avoid leaving pet food outdoors overnight. Dog and cat foods can attract other animals, such as bears, raccoons, foxes, and opossums, depending on where you live. Wild animals grow accustomed to receiving easy meals and this could decrease their trepidation about being around a home or yard. Run-ins between your pets and wild animals should be avoided at all costs.
- ~ Skip the retractable leash. Walking a pet on a non-retractable leash allows better control of the pet in the event of an encounter with a person or another animal.
- Be cautious with chemicals. Carefully consider any chemicals you use in your yard, including pesticides and weed killers, as well as
 any cleaning products used indoors. Pets can ingest or inhale these products and get sick.
- ~ Pick up potential choking hazards. String, small pieces of toys, rawhide bone fragments, and other items can be choking hazards to pets. Be diligent about removing these items from the floor so that pets will not swallow them.
- ~ Tap on your car hood. Families who allow their cats outdoor access should thump on the car hood when it is cold outside, as sometimes cats take shelter near a warm engine block. Cats can become injured if you start the car while they are under the hood.
- ~ Stay up-to-date on vaccinations. Whether pets never step outdoors or have free rein, always vaccinate companion animals against common parasites and other pests.
- Microchip your pets. Microchips not only protect pets should they get lost, but they also can help track down animals that may have been stolen. Remember to keep microchip data current to ensure a swift recovery.
- ~ Keep foods and medicines out of reach. Many human foods can be toxic to pets, as can medications that are kept in a home. Pets can be curious and easy access to these items may make them quite ill.

Pets need their owners to take key steps to safeguard their well-being.

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
