

Treat your Valentine to gluten-free sweets

Valentine's Day is an opportunity to lavish love and attention on a special person in your life. Exchanging gifts, enjoying dinner out and snuggling with your sweetheart are commomplace on this mid-February holiday devoted to love. It is equally common to enjoy a sweet dessert to cap off this romantic day.

Food allergies and intolerances do not take a holiday when Valentine's Day rolls around. For those who live gluten-free, finding a dessert that suits their diet might prove a tad challenging. Luckily it is relatively easy to whip up a gluten-free dessert and ensure that Valentine's treats can be enjoyed by all. This recipe for "Snickerdoodles" from "Cozy Kitchen Allergy-Friendly Cooking" (Umbrella Sky) by Jeanette Smerina, is gluten-, soy- and dairy-free, but certainly not free of delicious flavor. What's fun about these cookies is cooks can use colored sugar to customize them for any occasion. Use red and pink for Valentine's Day.

Snickerdoodles (Makes 25 to 30)

21/2 cups gluten-free flour, 1-1 blend

teaspoon cream of tartar

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/4 teaspoon salt

cup granulated sugar

1/2 cup olive oil

2 1 eggs

tablespoon vanilla extract

3 tablespoons almond milk

For rolling and coating:

1/4 cup granulated sugar (or colored sugar)

2 tablespoons cinnamon

1. In the bowl of a stand mixer, add the flour, cream of tartar, baking soda, and salt. Mix on low just to combine.

2. In a small bowl or large measuring cup, whisk together oil, eggs, sugar, and vanilla extract until thickened.

3. Add the egg and sugar mixture to the dry ingredients, and mix until just combined. Then add the almond milk and blend once more.

4. Cover and chill dough for 30 minutes or more. Meanwhile, preheat oven to 400 F. Line two cookie sheets with parchment paper or use silicone baking mats.

5. In a shallow bowl, combine sugar and cinnamon. Scoop small balls of the cookie dough (about an inch in diameter) and roll in the cinnamon and sugar mixture. Place each ball 2 inches apart on the cookie sheets. Repeat until all dough is used. The cookies will puff and enlarge while cooking.

6. Press down slightly on all cookie balls to flatten a bit. Bake cookies 8 to 10 minutes, or until edges of cookies are looking set up.

7. Cool cookies on racks. Store in covered containers for up to one week.









What Are the Roots of Groundhog Day?

Groundhog Day is a lighthearted tradition that millions of people enjoy each February, and the custom may have much older roots than celebrants realize. The American Folklife Center & Veterans History Project notes that folklorist Don Yoder, in his 2003 book Groundhog Day, traced the origins of the holiday to pre-Christian festivals that also led to holidays like Halloween. Yoder asserted the timing of the festival that is now celebrated as the holiday Groundhog Day, which falls in between the winter solstice and the spring equinox, symbolizes how significant and anticipated changes in the seasons were within pre-Christian society. That's one reason why the festival that served as a precursor to Groundhog Day survived when western European societies became Christianized.



Feed your game day crowd with smoked chicken wings

Sports fans across the globe tune in when the National Football League hosts its annual championship game each winter. And that already robust viewership is growing, as figures from Nielsen Fast National and Adobe Analytics indicated Super Bowl LVIII between the Kansas City Chiefs and San Francisco 49ers garnered 123.4 million viewers who tuned in to watch Patrick Mahomes orchestrate a 25-22 overtime victory over Kyle Shanahan and the Niners.

Super Bowl Sunday has become an unofficial holiday in the United States, where fans ranging from the diehard to the casual to those simply tuning in for the commercials and halftime show gather to enjoy a few fun-filled hours. Seasoned party hosts know that food features as prominently as football and fun come Super Bowl Sunday. Guests may expect a few staples, including chicken wings. With that in mind, hosts can impress their guests by serving up this recipe for "Virgil's Smoked Chicken Wings With Blue Cheese Dip" from Neal Corman's "Virgil's Barbecue Road Trip Cookbook" (St. Martin's Press).

Virgil's Smoked Chicken Wings With Blue Cheese Dip (Serves 4)

ue Cheese Dip

2 cups blue cheese crumbles, divided

1 cup mayonnaise 1/2 cup buttermilk

2 teaspoons hot sauce

1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

1/2 teaspoon kosher salt

1/4 cup finely chopped scallions

1/4 cup finely chopped celery

Marinade

1/2 cup vegetable oil
1/2 cup hot sauce

4 tablespoons Virgil's Dry Rub

(see below)

4 tablespoons granulated garlic

tablespoons granulated onion

Juice of 1/2 lemon

Sauce


10 tablespoons unsalted butter 1 teaspoon cornstarch 4 tablespoons white vinegar

3/4 cup hot sauce

4 teaspoon cayenne pepper

Wings

8 large chicken wings 1/2 cup Virgil's Dry Rub (see ----->>>)



Virgil's Dry Rub Makes 5 to 5 12 cups

2 1/2 cups sweet paprika 1 cup granulated sugar

1/2 cup Texas-style chili powder
1/2 cup minced onion

1/2 cup granulated garlic
1/4 cup dried parsley flakes
6 tablespoons kosher salt

Combine all of the ingredients in a medium bowl and whisk together until completely incorporated. Transfer to a covered bowl with a tight-fitting lid.

- 1. To make the dip, combine 1 cup of the blue cheese, mayonnaise, buttermilk, hot sauce, Worcestershire sauce, and salt in the bowl of a food processor and blend on low until smooth.
- Remove to a medium mixing bowl and fold in the rest of the blue cheese, scallions and celery, being sure to break up the larger blue cheese crumbles. Place in a covered container and refrigerate overnight.
- 3. Mix all the marinade ingredients in a large mixing bowl. Place the wings in a large container with a lid and pour the mixture over the wings. Toss until the wings are thoroughly coated. Cover and refrigerate for 2 days.
- 4. Preheat the grill or smoker to 245 F.
- 5. Spread out the wings on a sheet pan and wipe away any excess marinade. Sprinkle liberally with the dry rub, coating the wings all over.
- 6. Position the wings on the grill away from the direct heat of the coals or burners, and add hickory to the smoker or hickory chips on the coals or gas burners.
- 7. Cook the wings for about 3 hours, flipping every 30 minutes (their internal temperature should be about 165 F when cooked).
- 8. While the wings are cooking, cut the butter for the sauce into 1-inch cubes and refrigerate. Whisk the cornstarch into the white vinegar in a small bowl.
- 9. In a medium saute pan over medium heat, bring the hot sauce to a simmer and whisk in the thickened vinegar. Return to a simmer, cook for 1 minute, and remove from the heat.
- 10. Add the cayenne and slowly whisk in the cold butter. Keep warm until serving.
- 11. Remove the wings from the smoker or grill and put half of them into a bowl, cover with the sauce, and toss. Repeat with the remaining wings and serve on a platter, with the blue cheese dip on the side.



Can certain foods lower cancer risk?

Cancer is a prolific group of diseases that can affect any area of the body. Although many cancers can be successfully treated, cancer avoidance is undeniably preferable. There is no way to completely prevent a cancer diagnosis, but certain foods may help to reduce your risk for the disease.

According to MD Anderson Cancer Center, cancer-fighting foods are plant-based items that are rich in phytochemicals, which also are called phytonutrients. UC Davis Nutrition Department says phytochemicals are bioactive compounds found in vegetables, cereal grains and plant-based beverages like tea. Researchers have found phytochemicals can protect humans from environmental toxins and metabolic processes that can lead to chronic diseases, such as cancer and heart disease. Polyphenols are good examples of phytochemicals.

Health experts recommend packing every meal with healthy and nutritious foods that include plenty of vegetables, whole grains, fruits, and beans. MDACC recommends filling at least two-thirds of a plate with these healthy options. The remaining one-third of the meal should come from lean meat, fish or plant-based proteins and nuts/seeds. It also is important to limit foods that may increase cancer risk, including sugar-sweetened drinks and foods, processed meats, red meat, and alcohol.

When revamping diets to help reduce cancer risk, these heavy hitters should be included:

 - ~Lean Chicken~Lentils and Other Legumes/Beans~
 - ~Oatmeal~Oranges~Quinoa~Sweet potatoes~Tomatoes~
- ~ Whole grains, including Brown Rice~Leafy Greens~ Making smart food choices can keep a person healthy and may reduce the risk of cancer.

5 behaviors that increase cancer risk

Cancer can strike at any time and anywhere in the body. Although sometimes cancer seemingly comes out of the blue, people diagnosed with cancer may be able to trace their disease to certain behaviors that likely increased their risk. The following are various behaviors that researchers have determined can increase cancer risk.

1. Tobacco use

The American Association for Cancer Research says tobacco use is the leading preventable cause of cancer. Quitting tobacco can be the single most effective way to reverse the course of potential cancer development.

2. Alcohol consumption

The Centers for Cancer Control and Prevention says all alcoholic drinks, including red and white wine, beer, and liquor, are linked with cancer. Reducing alcohol consumption or not drinking at all can lower cancer risk.

3. Carrying excess weight

The MD Anderson Cancer Center says the link between obesity and cancer risk is clear. Experts believe it is largely due to the inflammation caused by visceral fat, which is the fat that surrounds vital organs.

4. Poor diet

Eating a lot of fast food, processed foods and red meat and consuming sugary drinks can increase the risk of cancer.

5. Failure to protect the skin

UV exposure from the sun or indoor tanning devices can increase the risk of skin cancer developing. In addition to never using tanning beds, individuals should use proper sun protection, including sunscreen, and stay out of the sun during peak hours, which are typically between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Although there are no certainties when it comes to cancer prevention, individuals can modify many behaviors to help reduce their risk for the disease.

Popular foods that can compromise heart health

Certain foods have generated devoted followings among people from all walks of life. While flavorful foods can be hard to resist, some wildly popular items found in refrigerators and pantries far and wide could be compromising millions of people's heart health. The National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute notes that food and heart health are inextricably linked. Individuals who prioritize including heart-healthy foods in their diets can lower their risk for various cardiovascular diseases, including heart attack and stroke. Those who succumb to the temptation of less heart-healthy foods may pay a considerable price for such indulgences. The World Health Organization reports that cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death across the globe, and poor dietary choices are among the handful of variables contributing to those high mortality rates. While the following popular foods might be delicious and tough to avoid, they also have a reputation for compromising heart health.

Bacon: The sizzling sounds and enticing aromas of bacon, not to mention its flavor profile, make this a hard-to-resist food. However, health care experts note that bacon is high in cholesterol and saturated fat. Saturated fat can be especially bad for heart health, which is one reason why the American Heart Association advises individuals aim for a dietary plan in which less than 6 percent of calories come from saturated fat. That makes bacon a no-go for individuals interested in a hearthealthy diet, as a single slice of uncooked bacon typically contains 110 calories.

Red meat: Red meat is another appetizing but heart-unhealthy food. Like bacon,


- red meat tends to be high in saturated fat, though that content varies depending
 on the cut and the type of meat chosen. For example, grass-fed beef contains less saturated fat than grain-fed beef. In addition,
 cuts that are not considered lean, which include beef short ribs, rib-eye steaks and T-bone streaks, also tend to be higher in
 saturated fat, and thus less heart-healthy, than leaner cuts like sirloin and extra-lean ground beef.
- ~ Baked goods: Baked goods may be irresistible, but that status might change when people recognize that regular consumption of cookies, cakes and muffins has an adverse effect on heart health. WebMD notes that baked goods have been linked to elevated triglyceride levels. That's significant, as the Cleveland Clinic reports that high triglyceride levels in the blood can lead to a condition known as hypertriglyceridemia, which can harm the heart and blood vessels. Eating too many baked goods also can lead to weight gain and potentially overweight or obesity, each of which the AHA identifies as a significant risk factor for heart disease.
- ~ Processed meats: Fans of deli meats may insist there's no better midday meal than a sandwich, but their hearts might beg to differ. Processed meats, which include deli meat but also foods such as sausage and hot dogs, contain high amounts of salt and are often loaded with saturated fat. A 2021 study published in The American Journal of Clinical Nutrition found that eating a little more than five ounces of processed meat per week increases a person's risk of cardiovascular disease by 46 percent. Five ounces equates to roughly five slices of deli meat cut 1/8-inch thick.

Certain foods like bacon and red meat are hard to resist. However, those who want to preserve their heart health are advised to eschew these fan favorites and replace them with alternatives that help to lower their risk for cardiovascular disease.



Warm up one spoonful at a time

People who live in cold climates understand that it can sometimes be challenging to warm up after a day spent combatting snow, wind or freezing rain. Luckily, eating hot soup is a very effective means to returning the body to a less-chilled temperature. Soup also tends to be easily digested and nutrient-dense, making it an ideal meal at any time.

This recipe for "Sweet Potato and Peanut Soup" from "The Culinary Institute of America Book of Soups" (Lebhar-Friedman Books) by The Culinary Institute of America is thick, creamy and full of savory flavor.

Sweet Potato and Peanut Soup (Makes 8 servings)

3 tablespoons unsalted butter

1 celery stalk, coarsely chopped (about 1/2 cup)
1 onion, coarsely chopped (about 11/4 cups)

garlic clove, minced (about 1/2 teaspoon)

1/2 leek, white and light green parts, coarsely chopped (about 3/4 cup)
11/2 sweet potatoes, peeled and sliced 1/2-inch thick (about 3 cups)

1 quart chicken broth

3 tablespoons creamy peanut butter

1/4 cinnamon stick

11/3 cups heavy cream, divided

Salt to taste

2 tablespoons molasses

Freshly grated nutmeg, to taste

3/4 cup peanuts

Preheat the oven to 325 F. Melt the butter in a soup pot over medium heat. Add the celery, onion, garlic, and leek. Stir to coat. Cook, stirring frequently, until the vegetables are softened, 4 to 6 minutes.

Add the sweet potatoes, broth, peanut butter, and cinnamon stick. Bring to a simmer and cook until the potatoes are fully tender, about 25 minutes.

Meanwhile, spread the peanuts in a single layer in a pie pan. Toast the peanuts in the oven until light brown, 3 to 5 minutes. Shake the pan occasionally and watch carefully (nuts can burn quickly). Let the peanuts cool, chop coarsely, and set aside.

Remove the cinnamon stick and discard. Puree the soup and strain it. Return the soup to the soup pot and place over low heat. Add 1/2 cup of the cream. Season with salt. Keep warm, but do not boil.

Combine the remaining cream with the molasses, nutmeg and a pinch of salt. Whip until stiff peaks form.

Serve the soup in heated bowls, garnished with the whipped cream and chopped nuts.

"I'm sorry we're so slow today," Candace said. "It's the holiday. I'll have your food out shortly."







The impact of reading on cognitive decline


Aging and change go hand in hand. Although some may bemoan the gray hairs that start to arrive or stiffness in the knees that seems to sneak up on a person in middle age, such concerns are not necessarily enough to lose sleep over. However, many people 50 or older are nervous about the potential for cognitive issues like dementia as they grow older.

The Alzheimer's Association estimates that 6.7 million people have Alzheimer's disease in the United States. The Alzheimer Society of Canada estimates that there were 733,040 people living with dementia in the country as of January 1, 2024. Alzheimer's disease and other dementias can rob people of their memories, personalities and abilities to live satisfying, independent lives. While it may not be impossible to prevent all cognitive issues completely, there is reason to believe that reading could be an ally in cognitive care. The American Academy of Neurology says that reading stimulates the brain and has been shown to slow down cognitive decline in old age. Reading also may help slow down memory loss.

The powers of reading were noticed more than 10 years ago when a 2013 study from researchers at Emory University measured readers' MRI scans as they read books. They found the deeper readers went into a story, the more areas of their brains were activated. This activity remained elevated for several days after participants finished their books. The more a person reads, the stronger complex networks in the brain become.

Additional evidence that reading can help the brain was noted by researchers at the Texas A&M School of Public Health. A 2024 study suggests that older people with mild cognitive impairment who engage in high levels of activities like reading, hobbies and word games have better memory, working memory, attention, and processing speed than those who do not take part in such endeavors. Furthermore, a 2021 study published in Neurology found that high levels of cognitive activity, like reading and writing letters, can delay the onset of Alzheimer's disease by five years among those age 80 and over. Reading can keep brains functioning optimally and potentially delay age-related cognitive decline.







Each year millions of dogs and cats are euthanized in shelters because of overpopulation. Just a few years ago, during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, shelters were emptied out as pet adoptions reached all-time highs. Now that offices have reopened and people have returned to work and other activities, pets increasingly are being surrendered to shelters again, once more leading to

Overburdened shelters also are made worse by litters of animals born to unsterilized parents. The American Veterinary Medical Association says spaying and neutering are important tools for preventing unplanned or unwanted litters, and reducing pet overpopulation. Most experts agree there is little benefit to leaving pets' reproductive systems intact. Even family pets can get loose and mate unintentionally. The following are six notable benefits to spaying or neutering a pet.

- Prevent the conception and birth of unwanted animals.
- 2. The ASPCA says spaying prevents uterine infections and decreases the incidence of breast tumors, which are malignant or cancerous in about 50 percent of dogs and 90 percent of cats. Spaying a pet before the first heat offers the best measure of
- 3. Neutering male animals prevents testicular cancer if done before six months of age.
- 4. Neutered animals are less likely to roam and become nuisances. Female cats can go into heat four to five days every three weeks during breeding season. While in heat they will yowl and urinate frequently. Males will be on the prowl for females and can get into fights. Spaying and neutering reduces these tendencies.
- 5. Neutering and spaying is a lot less costly than having and caring for a litter. It also prevents medical treatment from being needed in the event a pet gets into a fight over mating.
- 6. Although the surgery will reduce some undesirable behaviors, it is not a magic fix for all behavioral problems, including bad habits.

The ASPCA says the traditional age to sterilize dogs is between six and nine months. Healthy puppies as young as eight weeks can undergo a spaying or neutering surgery. For cats, it is generally considered safe for kittens as young as eight weeks old. To avoid the start of urine spraying, neuter or spay a cat before the animal reaches five months of age.

Millions of cats reside safely in people's homes, but many more are stray, outdoor cats that make their living quarters in any spots where they can find shelter. These outdoor cats also mate with one another, producing litter upon litter of kittens that quickly lead to overpopulation. The SPCA of York County says a single unspayed female cat can birth about 180 kittens in her lifetime, on average. Females have the potential to give birth three to four times per year. Outdoor cats can be nuisances in neighborhoods, digging, urinating or defecating in people's yards. They also may sleep under people's cars or close to the engine to stay warm, where they are vulnerable to injuries, accidents or even death. Stray cats also may get into tussles with domesticated pets, leading to other injuries. Controlling overpopulation of cats, which may end up in shelters and other facilities, often comes down to sterilization. People who have cats as pets are urged to keep them indoors at all times and to spay or neuter them. In regard to feral or stray cats, the Humane Society of the United States suggests a solution of TNR: trap, neuter, return. TNR is a non-lethal way to deal with overpopulation to help improve the quality of life for cats. A growing number of animal welfare organizations have TNR programs and can connect people with the resources they need.
