





Fish and chips is an ideal meal throughout Lent

Lent is an important time of year for Christians across the globe. Lent is a season of sacrifice, and many practicing Christians abstain from consuming flesh meat on Fridays in the weeks preceding Easter.

Abstaining from meat on Fridays throughout Lent does not require devoted Christians to avoid flavor. In fact, there are many flavorful non-meat dishes for Christians to choose from each Friday during Lent. One particularly flavorful option is this recipe for "Gourmet Fish and Chips" from Lines+Angles.

Gourmet Fish and Chips (Makes 4 servings)

For the mushy peas:

- 8 cups vegetable oil, for deep-frying

- 1 teaspoon onion powder or onion salt

large white fish fillets, approximately 2 lbs., such as cod or haddock,

- lemons Sprig curly parsley
- 1. For the mushy peas: Combine the peas with the baking soda in a large saucepan. Cover with 8" water. Cover and chill overnight. 2. The next day, drain and rinse thoroughly with cold water.

3. Return the peas to a large saucepan and cover with about 0.5" water. Bring to a boil over a high heat before reducing to a simmer until tender to the bite, about 30 to 40 minutes; skim away any froth that rises to the surface and edges.

- 4. Remove from the heat and stir in the butter. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Cover and set aside until ready to serve.
- 5. For the chips/fries: Cut the potatoes into fries. Submerge in a large bowl of water as you heat the oil.

6. Heat the oil in a large, heavy-based saucepan to 285 F; use a thermometer to accurately measure the temperature.

7. Remove the potatoes from the water and pat dry with a paper towel. Place in a large mixing bowl and sprinkle over the corn starch, onion powder and some salt, tossing well to combine.

8. Deep-fry the potatoes until soft and starting to color, about 10 minutes. Drain on paper towel and cover loosely with aluminum foil to keep warm. 9. Increase the temperature of the oil to 355 F. Working in two batches, return the fries to the oil and fry until golden-brown and crisp all over.

10. Remove from the oil and drain on paper towels. Season with salt and cover loosely with aluminum foil to keep warm; reserve the oil. 11. For the fish: Return the frying oil to 355 F; use a kitchen thermometer to accurately gauge the temperature.

12. In the meantime, season the fish with salt and pepper

13. Combine the flour, egg, 1 teaspoon salt, and some freshly ground black pepper in a large mixing bowl. Whisk briefly to combine before slowly whisking in enough of the beer to make a thick, smooth batter.

14. Working one by one, drop the fish fillets into the batter, turning to coat evenly.

15. Let the excess batter drip off the fish before carefully lowering into the hot oil. Deep-fry until golden-brown and crisp, about 4 minutes. Remove from the hot oil and

drain on paper towel, covering loosely with aluminum foil.

16. Repeat steps 14 and 15 for the remaining fish.

17. Reheat the fries in the hot oil if needed, draining well.

18. To serve: Divide the mushy peas between ramekins and place on plates. Divide the fries into individual serving baskets and arrange next to the fish on the plates.

19. Cut the lemons in half, scoring a zig-zag pattern into them with a paring knife. Serve alongside the fish and fries, garnishing the fish with gherkin slices and some parsley sprigs.











Anything that takes drivers' attention away from the road can be considered a distraction, and that includes phones, food, passengers, and even vehicle features like a GPS system. However, distracted driving is preventable. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says nine people in the United States are killed every day in crashes that involve a distracted driver. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration says distracted driving claimed the lives of 3,308 people in 2022. In addition, data from Transport Canada's National Collision Database indicates distracted driving contributed to an estimated 22.5 percent of fatal collisions and 25.5 percent of serious injury collisions in 2021. These distracted driving numbers reflect a growing trend of distracted driving-related incidents.

Warm up with Irish stew this St. Patrick's Day

St. Patrick's Day is known for revelry. A festive atmosphere prevails each March 17, and people from all walks of life and genealogical backgrounds take part in festivities that have become celebrations of Irish culture.

Cuisine is a big part of Irish culture, even if it's not the first thing people think of when pondering the Emerald Isle. This St. Patrick's Day, celebrants can bring a touch of Irish cuisine to their celebrations by preparing the following recipe for "Irish Guinness Stew with Lamb" courtesy of Lines+Angles.

Irish Guinness Stew with Lamb (Makes 6 servings)

- 8 cups lamb or beef stock; divided
- 1 cup pearl barley
- 3 lb. lamb shoulder, cubed
- Salt. to taste
- Freshly ground black pepper, to taste 3 tablespoons oil
- 1/2 cup unbleached all-purpose flour
- stalks of celery, washed, trimmed and chopped
- large yellow onions, peeled and chopped
- 4233 cloves of garlic, minced
- large carrots, peeled and roughly chopped
- 12 fluid ounces Guinness stout
- 1 bunch fresh parsley
- 1 bunch fresh thyme
- 1 bunch fresh rosemary
- 3 large potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 4 teaspoons water

1. In a medium saucepan set over medium heat, bring 3 cups of stock to a boil; add barley. Reduce heat to low and gently simmer for 20 minutes. Set aside.


2. Meanwhile, pat the meat dry with paper towels. Season the meat with salt and pepper. Heat the oil in a 6-quart Dutch oven. Brown the meat on all sides over medium-high heat. Using a slotted spoon, remove the meat from the pot. Sprinkle flour over the meat, shaking off any excess; set aside.

3. Add the celery, onions, garlic and carrots to the pot and saute until onions are soft and translucent. Add Guinness and deglaze the pot, scraping up all the caramelized bits on the bottom and sides of the pan.

4. Chop the leaves of the parsley, reserving the stems. Tie the parsley stems and several sprigs of thyme and rosemary into a bundle; drop the bundle into the pot. Chop the remaining thyme and rosemary; set chopped herbs aside.

5. Return the meat to the pot. Add the potatoes, barley and enough stock to cover the meat and vegetables. Bring to a boil over medium heat. Reduce heat to very low and simmer for 2 to 3 hours, or until meat is fork tender. Stir occasionally, adding remaining stock as necessary.

6. Check seasoning; adjust to taste. Stir in chopped parsley, hyme and rosemary. Mix cornstarch in water and stir. Add to stew, stirring to incorporate. Cook over low heat for 5 to 10 minutes or until stew thickens. Ladle into bowls. Serve with crusty bread and of course more Guinness if desired.

The best-selling books of all time

Popular books have a way of finding their way into homes across the globe. Indeed, certain books transcend geographical boundaries and entice readers from all walks of life and cultural backgrounds. Estimates indicate this first book in the series is the best-selling Harry Potter title to date, with roughly 120 million copies sold since its initial publication in 1997.
- ~ "And Then There Were None" by Agatha Christie: English mystery master Agatha Christie was a prolific writer, with more than 66 detective novels to her credit. None sold more than this classic murder mystery, which has sales of around 100 million copies since it was first published in 1939.
- "Dream of the Red Chamber" by Cao Xueqin: Western audieces may not recognize this title as readily as the other books that qualify for the list of the best-selling works of all time, but this classic Chinese novel written in 1791 has sold roughly 100 million copies over the centuries.
- "The Hobbit" by J.R.R. Tolkien: "The Hobbit" preceded Tolkien's "The Lord of the Rings Trilogy," sales of which are believed to have exceeded 150 million copies (the trilogy was serial ized, but many copies have since been sold in a single-volume work, making it difficult to determine where each book ranks on a list of best-selling titles of all time). Popular in its own right, "The Hobbit" has sold an estimated 100 million copies since Tolkien first introduced the world to "Bilbo Baggins" in 1937.
- "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe" by C.S. Lewis: Many a child across the globe has had this 1950 work from C.S. Lew is on their bookshelf. Kids simply love the world of Narnia, which has helped to sell 85 million copies of this beloved tale.

These are just some of the best-selling books of all time, and each are worthy of a read of re-read for book lovers who enjoy a good page turner.

The Perfect Tissue Box

Next on the shopping list - tissues. I could picture it so clearly, in my mom's beautiful handwriting. Blue ink, very legible, not like mine where I have to ask my husband to decipher what I wrote.

Ugh, that meant the dreaded paper product aisle.

The floor smelled like commercial-grade cleaning chemicals. People were talking, kids were running, parents were reprimanding, and our shopping cart with its wobbly wheel thump-thumping stopped in front of the wall of tissues.

I remember standing in the Pathmark supermarket aisle in front of the tissues for what seemed to be forever. There were probably hundreds of choices; ones with lotion, 2-ply, 3-ply, ultra soft, multi-pack, scented, unscented, name brand, store brand, cube-shaped boxes, and even travel size.

My mom always had to get just the right tissue box for each and every room of the house. The colors had to match the bedroom, bathroom, or wherever the tissues would be put.

For the tissue box going in the bathroom, certain things must be considered. The tissue box had to match the bathroom decor. In the bathroom, the shower curtain would be swapped out multiple times per year. The shower curtain matched the toothbrush holder, and the toothbrush holder matched the soap dispenser, and the soap dispenser matched the hand towels. And depending on the season, special hand towels would be set out. You know the kind that you see in other people's houses and you're afraid to use them so you wind up drying your hands on your pants and walking out like it didn't matter.

My mom would stand there in the aisle and hold her hand to her chin when she was deep in thought trying to choose the perfect tissue box because she wanted everything to look perfect for company. And I would always tell her that when people come to the house to see us. They are here to see us, not how clean our house is. And they certainly don't care about the tissue boxes. I told her no one was going to notice if the tissue box matches the shower curtain or if there's a tiny dent on the bottom of the box.

I would roll my eyes as she stood there picking up and examining the 6th or 7th or even 8th box. I wanted to go home and go swimming or just be anywhere other than that store waiting for her to pick out a box of stupid tissues.

A crushed or dented box would go back on the shelf immediately. Crushed or dented boxes were always rejects! It was like there was a hierarchy of importance to picking out just the right box. The condition was equally or more important than the color.

It wouldn't even be just us involved in this. My mom would often find someone who worked in the supermarket or some taller customer passing by to get one of the boxes on the top shelf.

While shopping, I think even she would get tired of everything. I remember her saying "I would love to have someone put it all away for me." Like there was a magical fairy or something. Or that she would snap her fingers when we got home and it would be done.

And then there was the task of getting the best deal, one that could be combined with a store sale, or a coupon that could be doubled, or stacked, or a coupon that just had to be used because it was about to expire soon, and she didn't want it to be wasted. I think sometimes she would even cut the date off of the coupon if it expired already. Shhhhh, don't tell anyone.

l can still hear the click of her nails tapping on the calculator seeing what we had spent so far. And I would watch her rustle through each of her many coupon files that were placed meticulously in the top part of the cart. Her nails were always nicely manicured and always some shade of mauve.

And then paying for the groceries was a whole `nother thing. Yep, my mom would be the one who held up the line, by writing a check, using all sorts of coupons, and schooling the cashier on their sales.

Who would have known that standing in the grocery store picking out tissues would be one of my most cherished memories? I didn't realize then that one of the things I hated most would be one of the things I miss the most. My mom passed away 27 years ago and I sometimes hear her voice when I'm picking out tissues.

I wanted to be anywhere else but there, but what I wouldn't give to be standing in that aisle right now. I want to be right back there looking for the perfect tissue box, no matter how long it takes. Maybe there is no such thing as the perfect tissue box, but I do know I had the perfect mother.






Paws off! Practice pet poison prevention Companion animals typically do not understand that certain items in their environments can be harmful. Pets' innate curiosity

coupled with unique aromas produced by common household items can put them in jeopardy of potentially deadly poisoning.

According to veterinary experts at WebMD Pet Health Center, an estimated 232,000 cases of pet poisoning occur annually in the United States. In March 2022, the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center hotline fielded 22 percent more calls stemming from incidents of pet toxicity than in 2021. The following are some steps pet owners can take to protect their companion animals against poisoning.

- Don't leave out human food. Dogs, cats and other animals may be lured by the sweet temptation of their owners' food. Many food scraps can be toxic to pets, including alcoholic beverages, chocolate, coffee beans, moldy foods, and raisins, among others. Keep the kitchen tidy and trash cans (indoor and outdoor) secured.
- Be careful with houseplants. While they may look beautiful and filter indoor air, certain houseplants can be toxic to pets if ingested. Before bringing any new plants into your home, check the ASPCA Toxic and Non-Toxic Plant Guide. Lilies may be pretty, but they also are quite toxic. The smallest nibble can be fatal to cats.
- Keep medications locked away. Be sure that over-the-counter and prescription medications are locked away and cannot be accessed by curious pets. Even seemingly mild medications, like human pain relievers, can be toxic to pets.
- Be safe when spring cleaning. Keep pets out of rooms when they are being cleaned by chemical products or when using insecticides. Wait a day or more before letting pets back into the area. Store products beyond a pet's reach when they're not in use.

With diligence, a significant percentage of pet poisonings can be prevented. Pet owners should do their homework about toxic items in and around their homes and do their best to keep pets safe.
