benefits of socialization for seniors

One of the primary lessons learned during the COVID-19 pandemic was how challenging social isolation can be. Social isolation often goes overlooked, but it's a key contributor to poor mental health.

Experts state that it is



increasingly important for adults to maintain an active social life as they age. There are many benefits that come from staying engaged and socializing with others. The following is a look at seven ways socialization benefits seniors.

- 1. Regular social interactions can help older adults avoid depression, anxiety and feelings of isolation, according to Integracare, a senior living company.
- 2. Social engagement can help reduce the risk of cognitive decline and dementia because socializing helps to keep the mind sharp through new experiences.
- 3. Socialization often revolves around an activity that gets seniors up and moving. While being sedentary is alright on occasion, consistently sitting or laying around can lead to high cholesterol, weight gain and high blood pressure. A 2019 study published in The Journals of Gerontology, Series B: Psychological Sciences and Social Sciences determined that older adults who interacted with people beyond their usual social circle of family and close friends were more likely to have higher levels of physical activity, greater posi tive moods and fewer negative feelings.
- 4. Regular social interaction may compel seniors to embrace healthier eating habits. Social events expose seniors to different types of food, which can help them get the nutri ents they need to live healthy.
- 5. Regular socialization can help seniors feel they are needed and have a sense of purpose, which can boost self-esteem. Engaging with others often means contributing to a commu nity, and that can be satisfying.
- 6. Getting out and interacting with others can serve as an informal wellness check, potentially alerting family and friends to issues that may need attention.
- 7. Getting outside and interacting with others can open seniors up to new hobbies. Whether that is participating in a new sport or joining a club, there are mental and physical advan tages to engaging socially.

Socialization is an important factor in seniors' overall wellness, and one that should be discussed along with diet, exercise and illness management.





Spice up brunch this Mother's Day

Children commonly like to give their mothers a break from cooking on Mother's Day. Youngsters may be eager to help out in the kitchen and whip up something that Mom is certain to enjoy. But many recipes can be complicated for younger children or others who might not be so adept with meal creation. However, with a few ingredients that families may already have on hand, it's possible to craft a delicious Mother's Day brunch.

This recipe for "Wee Chicken & Waffles with Jezebel-Maple Syrup" from Denise Gee's "Southern Appetizers: 60 Delectables for Gracious Get-Togethers" (Chronicle Books) utilizes commercially available miniature waffles and popcorn chicken bites to create a chicken and waffles dish with a kick. Serve alongside mini muffins, deviled eggs, cheese and crackers, and other brunch dishes that are simple for youngsters and their little fingers to prepare.

Wee Chicken & Waffles with Jezebel-Maple Syrup (Serves 10 to 12, Three or Four Waffles Each)

Jezebel-Maple Syrup

2 cups maple syrup

1/4 cup pineapple preserves

1/4 cup apple jelly

11/2 tablespoons prepared horseradish
3/4 teaspoon ground black pepper

1/2 teaspoon salt

40 mini waffles from a 10.9-ounce package, lightly toasted

40 pieces cooked fried popcorn chicken

Finely chopped fresh Italian flat-leaf parsley or green onion for garnish (optional)

Hot sauce for serving

To make the syrup: In a large microwave-safe glass measuring cup with pour spout (one holding at least 3 cups) or a bowl, add the maple syrup, pineapple preserves, apple jelly, horseradish, pepper, and salt; whisk to combine.

Microwave the mixture on high for 35 seconds. (You also can heat it in a small saucepan on low until the mixture is warm.) Stir and taste, adjusting the flavor if desired. Set the syrup aside.

Place the toasted waffles on a large serving platter. Top each waffle with a piece of chicken. Drizzle the chicken-waffle bites with about 1 teaspoon of the syrup. Garnish with the parsley, if desired, and serve with the remaining syrup and hot sauce.

The basics of fibromyalgia

Periodic pain is a part of life many people can effectively manage without the help of medical professionals. A sore knee after some pickup basketball or a stiff neck after an awkward sleep probably won't necessitate a trip or call to a doctor. But persistent pain does merit such concern, and could in fact be indicative of a condition known as fibromyalgia.

What is fibromyalgia?

The National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases describes fibromyalgia as a chronic disorder that causes pain and tenderness throughout the body. People with fibromyalgia also experience fatigue and trouble sleeping.

What are the symptoms of fibromyalgia?

The NIAMS indicates chronic, widespread pain throughout the body, an overwhelming feeling of being tired and difficulty sleeping are the main symptoms of fibromyalgia. But people with fibromyalgia may experience additional symptoms, including:

- ~ Stiffness in the muscles and joints
- ~ Some areas of the body may be tender to touch
- ~ Tingling in the arms and legs or a feeling of numbness in these areas
- ~ Increased sensitivity to certain stimuli, including light, noise, odors, and temperature
- Problems that affect digestion, including bloating or constipation

The symptoms of fibromyalgia are often physical, but some people experience cognitive signs as well. Cognitive symptoms are often characterized as "fibro fog," which is akin to brain fog that makes it hard to concentrate, think clearly or remember things.

What causes fibromyalgia?

The Cleveland Clinic notes that experts are uncertain about what causes fibromyalgia. But some studies have found a genetic link that suggests parents might pass the condition down to their children. However, the NIAMS points out that people with no family history of fibromyalgia still get it.

What are the risk factors for fibromyalgia?

Age and sex are two notable risk factors for fibromyalgia, which is most often diagnosed in individuals over 40. In addition, the Cleveland Clinic reports that women are twice as likely as men to experience fibromyalgia, and the NIAMS notes fibromyalgia affects people of all racial and ethnic backgrounds. Additional risk factors for fibromyalgia include:

- ~ Chronic illnesses: People with osteoarthritis are more likely to get fibromyalgia, as are individuals with certain mental health conditions, including depression and anxiety disorders. Irritable bowel syndrome also is considered a risk factor for fibromyalgia.
- ~ Stress: Excessive stress can be a risk for fibromyalgia.

Can fibromyalgia be treated?

Treatment for fibromyalgia may require some trial and error as health care professionals work to identify an option that works. Such options may include over-the-counter or prescription medication, including antidepressants; exercises that employ stretching and strength training; sleep therapy; cognitive behavioral therapy; or stress management therapy.

Mount Sinai indicates fibromyalgia affects between 1 and 5 percent of the general population. Understanding the disorder may help people better manage the pain it causes.

Stroke statistics tell a deadly story

Research conducted by the National Council on Aging and the LeadingAge LTSS Center @UMass Boston found that 80 percent of older adults are either currently financially struggling or are at risk of economic insecurity in retirement. Further analysis found that living in the community without some assistance is beyond the reach of most older adults. A French standard offers a unique way to prepare beef

Beef is a versatile ingredient that's popular in countries across the globe. There's no shortage of ways to prepare this favorite protein source. French chefs utilize beef in various recipes, and one popular dish is Beef Bourguignon. This stew works well as a comfort food, and has become a standard of French cuisines over the last century and a half and made widely popular in the United States when Julia Child first adapted the recipe. Those who want try their hand at cooking beef in the French fashion can look to this recipe for "Beef Bourguignon" from Lines+Angles.

Beef Bourguignon (Makes 6 servings)

11/2 tablespoons sunflower oil
ounces diced smoked bacon

2 1/4 lbs. beef steak, chuck, cut into 2 1/2-centimeter cubes

cup all-purpose flour
tablespoons unsalted butter

1 onion

3 carrots, peeled

14 ounces button onions, or small round shallots, peeled

finely chopped garlic cloves
 tablespoon tomato passata

3 cups good quality red wine (e.g., from Burgundy)

12/3 cups beef stock
3 bay leaves

to 5 sprigs young thyme, plus extra for garnishing

1 small bunch chives, snipped

Salt & Freshly ground black peppercorns

- 1. Preheat the oven to 275 F.
- 2. Heat the sunflower oil in a large, wide saute pan or casserole dish set over a moderate heat until hot. Add the bacon and fry until golden and crisp, 7 to 8 minutes. Remove from the pan to a plate lined with paper towels.
- 3. Dust the chuck steak with the flour, shaking off the excess. Season with salt and pepper before browning in the pan, in batches, over a moderately high heat. Remove from the pan to a bowl.
- 4. Return the pan to a medium heat. Add the butter, let it melt, and then stir in the onion, carrot, pearl onions, and a pinch of salt.
- 5. Saute for 8 to 10 minutes until colored. Add the garlic and tomato passata, and cook for a further minute.
- 6. Return the beef to the pan and deglaze with the wine, scraping the base to release any stuck-on bits.
- 7. Stir in the stock, bay leaves and thyme sprigs, and bring to a boil. Once boiling, transfer to the oven.
- 8. Braise for about 90 minutes to 2 hours, stirring occasionally, until the beef is tender and easy to pull apart.
- 9. Remove from the oven and season to taste with plenty of salt and pepper. Serve from the pan with a garnish of snipped chives and some thyme sprigs.

How to establish a peaceful backyard retreat



Mother's day crafts Mom will cherish

Many mothers will attest that few things are better than a little rest and pampering on Mother's Day. And when it comes to gifts, homemade items are among the most heartfelt.

Although schools and day care centers may take the lead and guide children through Mother's Day crafts, parents and caregivers looking to encourage kids to make crafts at home can explore these ideas that can turn into wonderful gifts or decorative items for Mom. Floral votive holders: Kids can create special candle holders that they customize with pressed or paper flowers. New jars can be purchased from a craft store or empty jars at home can be repurposed. Using Modge Podge or another durable adhesive, children can attach dried, pressed flowers to the outside of the jar by painting the adhesive over the flowers; otherwise, paper flowers cut out from tissue paper or construction paper can be used. Once dry, attach a piece of decorative twine, yarn or ribbon around the mouth of the jar. Place a tealight candle inside for Mom to enjoy.

Writing pen bouquet: Why not give Mom something that is both beautiful and functional this Mother's Day? Children will have fun making flower pen bouquets. All it takes are a few inexpensive disposable pens, floral tape and artificial flowers. Place an artificial flower stem alongside the pen. It should be short enough that it will not impede writing, so cut if necessary. The petals of the flower should be up at the non-writing end. Starting at the non-writing end of the pen, begin to wrap floral tape snugly around the stem and pen to just before the tip of the writing end. It is better to use too much floral tape than not enough. Repeat the process for as many pen flowers as you'd like to make, then offer as a gift in a vase.

Jewelry dish: Mom can keep her favorite pieces of jewelry safe with a heartfelt clay jewelry dish. It's easy to make with only a few materials. Using air-dry clay and a heart-shaped cookie cutter, children can roll out the clay and cut out the shape. Turn up the edges slightly to make a rim so that rings or earrings won't fall out of the dish later on. Then kids can press decorative items, such as beads, small seashells, sequins, or faux gems, into the clay. The jewelry dish is beautiful as-is, or it can be painted after dry.

Faux stained glass: This project mixes paint with glue to create a stained glass effect. The colors can be painted on any acrylic surface, whether it's a flat, plastic photo protector in a picture frame or clear, plastic cosmetic bottles. When the light hits the items, it will produce a prismatic effect just like the real stained glass. Take painter's tape and mark off a desired design, such as writing "I Love Mom." Using separate small containers (an empty foam egg carton would work well), add a little bit of clear school glue and a few drops of desired colors or acrylic paint. Paint the different colors as they pertain to the design or pattern. The glue and paint should dry quickly and extra coats can be applied depending on how intense you want the color to be. Once the stained glass is dry, peel off the painter's tape and gift.

diagnosis. Arthritis causes joint pain, stiffness and inflammation. The Cleveland Clinic reports osteoarthritis, a type of arthritis that is caused by wear and tear on the joints, is the most common type of the condition. Osteoarthritis can occur naturally as a person ages due to a life-

time of using the joints and wearing down their cartilage cushioning. Other types of arthritis occur from illness (gout) or the immune system can cause arthritis when it damages the joints by mistake (rheumatoid arthritis).

Energy levels and exercise needs merit consideration before adopting a new dog



Dogs add a whole new element to a family dynamic. Parents may adopt a dog not only because they love these loyal animals, but also because they hope to instill a sense of responsibility in young children who will be tasked with helping to take care of the family's furry new friend.

The level of interaction dogs require can vary greatly among the breeds. There's no shortage of breeds to consider as families look for a new dog, and it can help to recognize which dogs are especially energetic and which might be more enthusiastic about cuddle sessions on the couch. It's also worth noting that each individual dog is unique, so just because a dog is a certain breed does not mean it will automatically behave exactly the same as other dogs of the same

breed. However, breed reputation can be a good barometer as families look to bring a new dog into the fold. The following are five popular breeds and their corresponding exercise needs.

- 1. Akita: Akitas originated in Japan, and it's not uncommon to refer to this beautiful breed as the Japanese Akita. American Akitas also are popular, and these dogs may have higher energy levels than those from Japan. Akitas are large dogs and require regular walks and daily play sessions with their owners.
- 2. Bichon Frise: These small, cheerful pups require ample attention. Bichons typically weight between 10 and 18 pounds, so owners are unlikely to be exhausted by daily play sessions, which are necessary to ensure the dogs do not become overwhelmed by separation anxiety.
- 3. Dachsund (standard): These highly affectionate dogs typically weigh between 16 and 32 pounds. Dachsunds' stature can be deceptive in relation to their energy levels, as the American Kennel Club notes these dogs love to play and can even make for fine watchdogs. Ample exercise is vital to ensure dachsunds don't gain a lot of weight, and physical activity also helps them build strong muscles that support and protect their backs, which are lengthy and therefore vulnerable to disc damage if the dogs don't stay fit.

 4. French bulldog: French bulldogs do not require an especially high level of exercise. According to the AKC, a short walk or outdoor play session should be enough daily exercise for these lovable, bat-eared pups to stay in shape. Like English bulldogs, French bulldogs are flat-faced, which means they should be monitored closely and prevented from exerting themselves in hot or humid weather.

 5. German shepherd: German shepherds are large, agile and muscular, and those characteristics alone likely give prospective owners an idea of what to expect from these beautiful dogs in relation to exercise. The AKC notes German shepherds are very active and athletic, so they will need lots of exercise. Without sufficient exercise, German shepherds may develop problematic behaviors. Careful consideration of a breed's energy levels and exercise requirements can ensure families find a dog that will suit their situations and schedules at home.
