



## How to conduct a skin care self-exam

Time spent soaking up the summer sun is one of the things that makes the season so appealing. Warm outdoor air has a calming effect that can make anyone feel more relaxed and comfortable.

As good as warm summer sun can feel, overexposure to the sun can be dangerous. The World Cancer Research Fund reports there were more than 330,000 new cases of skin cancer diagnosed across the globe in 2022. A significant percentage of skin cancer cases can be prevented, and prevention is a multifaceted process that includes skin care self-examinations. Self-exams do not take up much time, and individuals can speak with their physicians about how frequently they should check their skin for signs of skin cancer. The U.S. National Library of Medicine offers the following instructions for how to conduct a skin self-exam.

- Choose the right time to examine your skin. The USNLM recommends conducting a skin exam after bathing. Women who routinely
  conduct breast self-exams can check their skin at this time as well.
- ~ Use a full-length mirror. It's not always easy to examine skin throughout the body. But signs of skin problems can occur anywhere on the body, including areas that might be hard to see without help. If possible, conduct a self-exam of the skin in front of full-length mirror in a brightly lit room.
- Identify what you're looking for. The USNLM notes you should be looking for any new skin markings. This includes bumps, moles, blemishes, and changes in skin color.
- ~ Pay close attention to preexisting moles. A potential sign of skin cancer includes moles that change over time. Examine preexist ing moles to see if they have changed in size, texture, color, and shape.
- ~ Look for unusual moles. The USNLM characterizes certain moles as "ugly duckling moles." These unique moles look and feel different from nearby moles and may be indicative of skin cancer. Speak with a dermatologist if a self-exam uncovers the presence of moles with uneven edges or differences in colors or asymmetric shapes. Moles that look different from one side to the other also should be brought to the attention of a dermatologist. Moles that do not stop bleeding or will not heal also merit examination by a skin care professional.

When the time comes to conduct the exam, the USNLM recommends following these steps:

- Look closely at your entire body, both front and back, in the mirror.
- Check under your arms and on both sides of each arm. Be sure to exa<mark>mine the backs of your upper arms, which can be hard to see.</mark>
- Bend your arms at the elbow, and examine both sides of your forear<mark>m.</mark>
- Examine the tops and palms of your hands.
- Examine the front and back of both legs.
- Examine your buttocks and between your buttocks.
- Examine your genital area.
- Examine your face, neck, the back of your neck, and scalp. Use both a ha<mark>nd mirror and full-length mirror, along with a comb, to see</mark> areas of your scalp.
- Examine your feet, including the soles and the spaces between your toes.
- Ask a person you trust to help examine hard-to-see areas.

Skin cancer poses a formidable threat, but many cases of the d<mark>isease are preventable. Routine skin self-exams are a vital component of skin cancer prevention.</mark>

## Skin Cancer is the 17th most common cancer



The World Cancer Research Fund reports that skin cancer is the seventeenth most common cancer across the globe. The United States, Germany and the United Kingdom had the highest number of skin cancer cases in 2022, and the U.S. also had the distinction of having the most deaths from skin cancer (7,368) in that year. Though individuals with naturally darker skin tend to think they might not be as vulnerable to the disease as fair-skinned individuals, that is not necessarily true. While it is true that fair-skinned individuals must be especially careful when spending time in the sun, the American Academy of Dermatology notes that skin cancer in patients with darker skin tones is often diagnosed in later stages of the disease when it's more difficult to treat. Simply put, all people, including those with naturally darker skin tones, must take the threat of skin cancer seriously and take every precaution to protect their skin when spending time in the sun.

- 1. Ladder toss: Also known as ladder golf, this game requires players to toss string-attached balls onto a ladder-shaped target.
  Points are awarded depending on which rung the ball lands on.
- 2. Kubb: Pronounced "KOOB," this Swedish lawn game believed to have originated during the era of the Vikings and is best described as a blend of bowling and horseshoes. Two teams compete to knock over their opponents' wooden blocks by throwing batons.
- 3. Cornhole: Many people have played cornhole, which involves tossing bean bags at the cornhole board, The objective is to get the bag into the hole or on the board to score points. The game can be played as singles or doubles. The first team to reach 21 points wins.
- 4. Spikeball<sup>a</sup>: Also called Roundnet, this two-on-two sport is played by hitting a ball off a net with the goal of preventing the opposing team from returning the ball within three touches.
- 5. Ring toss: This is another game that tests hand-eye coordination. Players take turns tossing the rings onto the target pegs. Each peg is worth a different number of points. The

first player to reach the agreed-upon amount of


points wins.

- 7. Kan Jam : Similar to cornhole or horseshoes, Kan Jam : features two teams of two that alternate between throwing a frisbee and trying to deflect it. The goal is to get the frisbee into the can.
- 8. Rollers: Goals are placed 25 feet apart and then players roll wooden discs to try to get closest to the goal. Each side of the disc has a different number to determine the point value.

Backyard events can be enhanced with some game play. There are plenty of fun options for your next gathering.







# Gus's Animal Gossip

## Dog parents can practice pet etiquette

Dogs are popular pets. Forbes Advisor reports 65.1 million h<mark>ouseholds in the United States</mark> have a dog, and there are roughly 89 million dogs in the country. According to Dogster, C<mark>anadians own about 7</mark>.9 million dogs as of 2022.

People have grown accustomed to treating their dogs like members of the family, and that means that dogs increasingly are being brought along on errands, traveling with their human companions, and even being brought into the workplace. It's important for pet parents to always be mindful of their dogs' behavior when out and about, or even hanging closer to home. Dog owners can follow these dog etiquette pointers to be responsible pet owners.

- Get permission from your employer before taking a dog to work. If you plan to take your pet into the workplace, whether during Take Your Dog to Work Day or Take Your Pet to Work Week, or any time of the year, it is best to check with management to find out if this is allowed. You must be mindful of people's dog fears or allergies and be respectful of others no matter how much fun it might be to bring your dog into a public space. The warm and fuzzy feelings dog owners feel for their dogs are not necessarily shared by everyone.
- ~ Quiet nuisance barking. Do not leave your dog outside unat<mark>tend</mark>ed for a long time. This can cause what the American Kennel Club characterizes as boredom barking. Quiet your dog if he or she is barking, or bring the pet indoors.
- Always leash your dog. Some people are not comfortable around dogs. And even if your dog is friendly, others met on walks or outings may not be. To prevent uncomfortable situations or even dog bites, it's best to always leash your dog. Choose a leash short enough to prevent your dog from jumping on passersby.
- Ask permission first. Check to see if your dog is allowed to greet people or other dogs. If someone says, "no," respect that answer.
- Clean up after your pet. Always have waste bags at the ready so you can clean up after your dog. This also applies indoors, should your dog have an accident inside a pet-friendly store.
- Be mindful of shopping with pets. Many stores do not allow dogs inside, but employees may be hesitant to approach pet owners about such policies. Many stores only allow trained service dogs that are Americans With Disabilities Act-compliant. Service animals are defined as dogs that are individually trained to work or perform tasks for people with disabilities. Service animal designations are exclusive to dogs. However, a number of people have "emotional support animals," which are not recognized as service animals. As a general rule of thumb, know a store's policy on non-service animal pets before visiting. And, when shopping at food stores, it's best to leave the dog at home.
- ~ Train your dog. A dog that knows basic obedience training will behave better in the community. If you are having trouble training your dog alone, consider working with an experienced dog trainer.

Dogs are beloved members of the family. However, pet owners should practice proper etiquette when dogs are out and about.

## Did you know?

According to the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, approximately 3.2 million cats enter animal shelters across the United States each year. A sizable number of cats also enter shelters each year in Canada, where Humane Canada reports just under 61,000 cats were taken in by shelters in 2021. Each of these figures underscores the need for cat adoption, but each also represents progress or at least a leveling off over previous years. The ASPCA reports that 7.2 million animals entered shelters across the U.S. in 2011, 3.2 million of which were cats. Though it would be better if that figure had decreased instead pof leveled off over the 10-year period between 2011 and 2021, it does indicate campaigns to promote spaying and neutering cats to avoid overpopulation have been successful. Cat shelter populations have decreased in Canada in recent years, as Humane Canada reports that figures exceeded 78,000 in 2019 before dropping below 61,000 in 2021.
